ORDER:

1. With reference to G.O. 1st cited, the Committee was constituted for fixation of fee in respect of Self-Financing Professional Colleges under the Chairmanship of Hon'ble Mr. Justice N.V. Balasubramanian.

2. The Committee decided to get proposals for revision of fees in respect of all Self Financing Engineering and Stand Alone Colleges. In this connection, individual letters have been sent to the Principals of all the Self Financing Engineering Colleges asking them to submit their proposals for revision of fee for the year 2017-2018 and two subsequent academic years in a prescribed format vide ref (2).
3. The President of the Consortium of Self Financing Professional Colleges requested the committee (vide letter dated: 27.02.2017 to extend the last date for submission of the fee revision proposals, considering the request the committee extended the last date for submission of fee revision proposal, for which individual letter have been sent by register post to all the colleges (vide ref(3)).
4. Even after the individual Reminder letters have been sent to all the colleges, only the following colleges submitted the proposal,
 - a) 313 Self Financing Engineering Colleges for B.E./B.Tech./B.Arch courses (Annexure --A),
 - b) 137 Self Financing Colleges for M.E./M.Tech./M.Arch Courses (Annexure --B),
 - c) 122 Self Financing Professional Colleges for the MBA course and MCA course (Annexure --C),
 - d) Rest of the Self Financing Engineering Colleges (Annexure --D) have not submitted their fee revision proposals.
5. The Committee decided to verify the expenditure statement based on the 20 Major heads namely Salaries and allowances including PF(Teaching, Non-Teaching and Administration), Welfare Expenses, Electricity Charges, Telephone. Postage &

Internet, Equipment Purchase, Books & Periodicals, Printing & Stationary, Consumable, Research and Development, University affiliation fees and Inspection Charges, Sports, Games, Meetings and Functions, Awards, Merit Scholarship, Travelling and Conveyance, Repairs and Maintenance, Depreciation, Advertisement and Miscellaneous Expenditures.

6. The Committee also decided to verify the proposals in detail and requested Thiru. V.Jagadisan, Member and (Chartered Accountant of reputed) to verify the details of expenditure submitted by the colleges and prepare the consolidated expenditure statements.
7. The Committee analyzed the consolidate expenditure statements in detail, and it was found that an average expenditure per student based on the details submitted by the colleges varies from Rs.20,000/- to Rs.80,000/- To arrive at a comprehensive fee for the students studying in various colleges located in rural and urban areas also based on the maximum and minimum range of proposed fee submitted by the institutions, the Committee decided to invite the representative of the Consortium and Association for discussion (vide ref(5)).
8. In response to the request of the Committee, the following representatives of the Consortium and Associations appeared before the Committee on

9. The Committee held the meeting on 25.05.2017 and the President of the Consortium Mr. R.S. Munirathinam requested the Committee to fix the fee considering the maximum fee fixed by the Sri Krishna Committee constituted by AICTE and also the fee fixed in the neighboring states. The representatives were informed that the representation will be considered in during fixation the fee.

10. The following seat sharing for admission of students in Self Financing Engineering Colleges, is already in vogue for several years,

ORDER:

12. The following maximum fee structure will take effect for the batch of the students admitted for the academic year 2017-2018, 2018 -2019 & 2019 -2020.

13. In addition to the above fees, the institution is permitted to collect an amount of Rs.5,000/- per student as development fee.
14. In addition to the above recurring annual fee, the concerned Institutions are permitted to collect a refundable one time caution deposit not exceeding Rs.5, 000/- per student at the time of admission, to be refunded at the time the student leaving the institution.
15. It is made clear that the fee fixed by the Committee is maximum fee is to be charged by the institution. It is open to the institutions to charge lesser fee than the fee fixed by the committee.
16. If any institution seek revision of the fee fixed, it is always open to the said institution apply for revision of fee to the committee along with the relevant records and book of accounts to the committee.
17. The management of the Self Financing Engineering Colleges are directed to cover all the students under Students Group Insurance Scheme. The above fee does not include Hostel, Transport, Mess charges.
18. The Committee recommends to the institutions to consider granting of partial waiver / concession of Rs.5, 000/- per annum in case of deserving meritorious students.
19. The Committee directs the Institutions shall not collect or levy any other recurring or non-recurring fee including capitation fee.

20. Any deviation of the order of this committee will entail serious penal consequences like withdrawal of approval by AICTE and disaffiliation by the concerned University as well as imposition of fine.

21. Any student / parent aggrieved by overcharging of fees if any, by the Institutions is at liberty to approach the committee for redressal.



ORDER:

In the Government Order first read above, the Government re-constituted a committee with the following members and authorized the members under section 9(1) of the Tamil Nadu Educational Institutions (Prohibition of Collection of Capitation Fee) Act, 1992 (Tamil Nadu Act 57 of 1992) to inspect and enquire into the complaints relating to collection of capitation fee and charging of tuition fee higher than the fee prescribed by the Committee on Fixation of Fee in respect of Self Financing Professional Colleges for the year 2012-2013:-

(1)	Dr. S.Selladurai, Professor, Department of Physics, Anna University, Chennai-25.
(2)	Dr. K.Palanivelu, Professor, Centre for Environmental Studies, Anna University, Chennai-25.
(3)	One member not below the rank of Associate Professor serving in the Government Engineering College or Constituent College (in the district or nearby districts in cases where there is no such college in the district) for each inspection or group of inspections.

2. In the Government Order second read above, the Government accorded that the Committee formed in the Government order first read above, for the year 2012-2013, be retained until the reconstitution of the new Committee to enquire and inspect Educational Institutions of Excess fee.

3. In the letters fourth read above, the Director of Technical Education has sent a proposal for the re-constitution of the Committee to inspect and enquire into the complaints relating to collection of capitation fee and charging of tuition fee higher than the fee prescribed by the Committee on Fixation of Fee in respect of Self Financing Professional Colleges, under section 9(1) of the Tamil Nadu Educational Institutions (Prohibition of Collection of Capitation Fee) Act, 1992 (Tamil Nadu Act 57 of 1992).

4. The Government after careful examination, direct that the Committee constituted in the Government order first read above, be reconstituted with the following members for the period of two years, from the year 2018-19 to 2019-2020 and the Government authorize the members of the re-constituted committee under Section 9(1) of the Tamil Nadu Educational Institutions (Prohibition of Collection of Capitation Fee) Act, 1992 (Tamil Nadu Act 57 of 1992) to inspect and enquire into the complaints relating to collection of capitation fee and charging of tuition fee higher than the fee prescribed by the Committee on Fixation of Fee in respect of Self Financing Professional Colleges:






Reservation details for Engineering - Anna University

Reservation has been a way for the government to uplift the lower segment of our community.

The pie chart below shows the details of reservation of engineering seats to different segments of our society.

Tamil Nadu native candidates alone will be considered for communal reservations.



Candidates seeking admission against ST/ SC / MBC & DNC / BC / BCM (BC Muslim) quota should obtain the certificates of social status issued by the competent authority in the prescribed Permanent Community Card in Tamil Nadu and enclose an attested copy of the same along with the application.

(a) The applicants from Tamil Nadu State should have a valid permanent community certificate in the card format issued by the competent authority (for ST/SC/MBC & DNC and BC in the format prescribed by the Government of Tamil Nadu in G.O. Ms. No. 781 (Revenue Department) dated: 02.05.1988. This is applicable for BCM (BC Muslim) also. In the case of ST candidates, the community certificate should have been issued by the Revenue Divisional Officer / P.A. (General) to the Collector of Chennai / Sub-Collector of the District concerned (except Chennai) vide Govt. Lr. No. 32061/ADWII/89-2, dt: 27.12.1989 and Lr. No. 21424/ADWII/94-4, dt: 15.11.1994 from the Secretary to Government, Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare Department, Chennai - 600 009. The Permanent Community Certificate Card issued to ST candidates by Tahsildars upto 11.11.1989 is valid.

(b) Community Certificate obtained from other states will not be considered for communal reservation.

(c) For communities linked with Districts (See Annexure-1) the candidates should obtain their community certificate in the respective districts. Community certificate obtained from other than the respective district will not be considered.

(d) If a candidate belongs to any one of Code No. 1 to 5 in item No. 9 in the application he/she should furnish an attested copy of Permanent Community Card Certificate. **Candidates who have not furnished an attested copy of the Permanent Community Card Certificate at the time of submission of the application will be treated as belonging to General Category (OC).**

They are further informed that in the event of such a decision, the eligibility conditions & rules prescribed for General Category will be applicable for such candidates and if such candidates do not satisfy the rules of General Category (OC), their applications are liable to be rejected. No correspondence in this connection will be entertained.

(e) ST / SC / MBC & DNC / BC / BCM (BC Muslim) candidates are eligible for selection under Open Competition in addition to the reservations made for them.

(f) The community recorded in the certificate of Tamil Nadu native candidate should figure in the list of communities approved by the Government of Tamil Nadu

Special Categories

Apart from the general reservation of seats Anna University also provides reservation for the following special categories

Children of ex-service men: 150

Children of freedom fighters: 10

Physically Handicapped - 3 % (Orthopedic- 1% / Hearing impaired 1% / Visual impaired 1%)

Sports Quota 100

Requirements.

Candidates claiming admission against the reservation of seats under Children of ex-service men, Children of freedom fighters and Physically Handicapped should enclose

Certificate in the format (Certificate No. II on Page No. 20) given in the information and instructions to candidates from an officer of the Department of Ex-servicemen, Welfare of Tamil Nadu not below the rank of Assistant Director of Ex-servicemen, Welfare of the district of which the dependent is a native. Candidates called for counseling should produce ID cards of their parents.

(ii) Candidates claiming admission against the reservation under Children of freedom fighter should enclose the certificate as per format given in Certificate III on Page No. 21. In addition they should also enclose a copy of the Jail Extracts or in its absence, Co-prisoner Certificate or certificate from Ex-Chief Minister or Ex-Minister or Ex-member of Legislature or Ex-member of Parliament as evidence that the Parent of the candidate is a Freedom Fighter suffered imprisonment for a period not less than one month subject to verification wherever it is found necessary.

(iii) Candidates seeking admission against the reservation Physically handicapped set apart for orthopedically Physically Challenged / Hearing impaired (Deaf) / Visually Impaired should

produce the certificate from the Medical Board of the District concerned certifying the nature and extent of disability in percentage and with regard to his/her suitability for admission to Engineering Colleges specifically mentioned below and in the format appended to this application (Certificate No. IV/V/VI) respectively. Certificates obtained from an individual Doctor will not be considered.

Eligibility criteria for various disabilities

Norms for Orthopedic Disability

Candidates with permanent physical impairment of 40% and above are considered as disabled. The candidates with orthopedic disability of the following types are eligible for claiming Engineering Admission against Physically Challenged category (Certificate No. IV on Page No. 22)

- a. Independent in ambulance with or without calipers but without walking aids.
- b. Good Standing Balance without calipers but without any support.
- c. Hand Function with normal limit without any aid
- d. Good control over bladder & bowel
- e. Disease must be non progressive

Norms for Hearing Disability

Candidates with hearing ability of 40 db and above only in the better ear with speech discrimination score of 50% and above are considered disabled and hence eligible for claiming Engineering Admissions against Physically Challenged category (Certificate No. V on Page No. 23).

Norms for Vision Impairment

Candidates with low vision of 40% and above are considered as disabled, and hence eligible for claiming Engineering

Admission against Physically Challenged category (Certificate No. VI on Page No. 24).

Low Vision: Person with low vision means a person with impairment of vision of less than 6/18 to 6/60 with best correction in the better eye or impairment of field in any one of the following categories:


- a. Reduction of fields less than 50 degrees.
- b. Heminaopia with macular involvement
- c. Attitudinal defect involving lower fields categories of Visual Disability all with correction

ONE EYED persons with normal vision are not considered as disabled.
